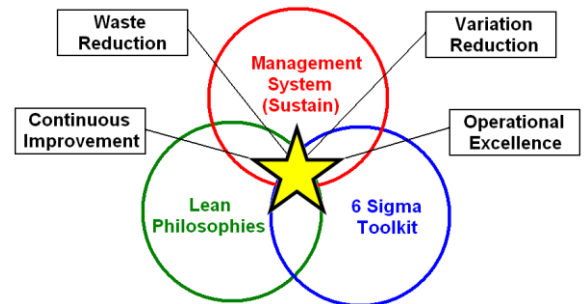
### Vision
